Quotes for the provision and installation of a new handrail have been sought and the preferred quote comes to the value of $\pounds1,060$ (+VAT) An additional 15% has been added for contingency to bring the total value to $\pounds1,210$

An additional 15% has been added for contingency to bring the total value to £1,219.

This option represents excellent value for money. We explored prices for different off -the-shelf options; and the price outlined above is slightly cheaper than buying an off-the-shelf handrail.
