This newsletter includes the latest updates of cleansing activities completed across Parks, Cleansing and Highways services as a result of extra investment to help keep B&NES tidy.

Recycle Week 2023

Bath and North East Somerset Council partnered with our neighbouring local authorities in the West of England area to spread combined messages as part of the Recycle Week between 16 – 22 October. The team promoted a national led campaign, The Big Recycling Hunt, which focused on recyclable items commonly placed in rubbish bins, such as cleaning bottles, empty aerosols, shampoo bottles and food tins.

On 19 October, our Waste Education Officer, Kirstie Hunter, visited Shoscombe Church School to inform children how to best recycle. This included an interactive game testing knowledge on waste and recycling in B&NES, followed by a Q&A in classrooms.

Highway Maintenance and Drainage

This year's investment supports Highways maintenance budget for roads, filling of grit bins and gully emptying. The team filled over 400 grit bins and inspected **1990** gullies of which **1829** were cleaned in October.

Graffiti Removal

Clean and Green continue to clear offensive and non-offensive graffiti from domestic and commercial properties in B&NES. Homeowners can request the graffiti removal service for free, while business owners will need to pay an at-cost charge. To request this service, property owners can fill out the online form.

Main Road Litter Picking

Clean and Green's funding contributes to an increased main road litter picking support on A4, A39 and A37. This October, Street Cleansing attended to Marksbury, The Globe, Hicks gate to the South Gloucestershire Boundary and from Hicks gate to Broadmead Roundabout. The team cleared **167** bags of litter.

Environmental Enforcement

B&NES Environmental Officers routinely carry out littering and fly-tipping inspections across the district. Lay-bys are a primary area of concern for illegal waste disposal. In October, **48** penalty notices were issued relating to commercial waste, littering, fly-tipping, and escape of controlled waste. The officers recently issued a penalty notice of £400 to an offender for fly-tipping of the materials below.

Cleaning of signs

The Response team supported sign-cleaning in Peasedown St John. Operatives washed road signs using brushes and squeegees with cleaning solutions to remove dirt and stains.



Reuse Shop

On 25 October, we opened the new Reuse shop in <u>Keynsham Recycling Centre</u>. The Reuse shop is cashless, taking card payments or payment via the customers smart phone only. Income received will cover staffing costs to ensure long term viability of the shop, with an extra supporting the council's wider recycling services. We have also partnered with local charities such as Julian House and Bath Share and Repair to ensure items can be distributed to where most needed too. During opening week, 312 residents visited the shop.
